Harbour House

Referral Process

Families apply to the Department of Transitional Assistance to determine eligibility for emergency assistance (EA).

Eligible families are placed in units throughout the state by the Department of Housing & Community Development.

More on the Fall River Family Center...

Fall River Family Center is convenient to the library, bus terminal, and also Charlton Hospital. It is situated in the historic downtown/lower Highlands neighborhood.

This 25-bed congregate emergency shelter for homeless families has the capacity to house 7 intact or single-parent households. The family center serves EA-eligible families, with a focus on heads of household age 21 and younger, domestic violence victims, and victims of natural disasters.

The objective is to assist families in finding permanent sustainable housing. A supportive environment is provided to referred families, regardless of race, nationality, gender, religion, or sexual orientation.
